Kiel, December 1, 2023 - In order to raise awareness of the gender pay gap in the labor market, the Erasmus+ project "Equal Pay For All" is developing measures to promote the empowerment of young and adult women.

KulturLife gGmbH is coordinating the project, which starts on December 1, 2023 and is co-funded by the European Commission as an Cooperation Partnership in the Youth strand of the Erasmus+ program.

Women are still often paid less than their male colleagues. Men are also promoted more often on average. Despite many efforts to close the gender pay gap, it remains a problem that seems to be deeply rooted in society and that women encounter on a daily basis.

"Equal Pay For All" addresses these issues and creates awareness to sensitize women as well as social workers, youth and women's associations, educational associations and stakeholders. The project includes activities such as a webinar series, a platform for exchange and campaigns. The project results will be made publicly available. Awareness of this issue must be raised in order to promote a just society. The starting point for change could lie with young people and the next generations.
