



## PRESS RELEASE

*Kiel, 23rd March 2023* – Promoting social inclusion, the Erasmus+ project “SIMPLY digitally INCLUDED” originates new methods and digital learning formats to help young people with migration and/or refuge background integrate into the European labor market. KulturLife gGmbH coordinates the project, which started on 31st December 2022 and is co-funded by the European Commission as an Erasmus+ Cooperation Partnership within the field of Vocational Education and Training.

Within the last years learning in digital formats increased. When learning offers like language classes and further education had to stop abruptly due to the Corona pandemic restrictions and resumed in digital formats only, especially the project’s target group had to face new challenges to proceed their learning. As a result, integration in the European labor market became even more difficult. “SIMPLY digitally INCLUDED” addresses these problems and creates solutions that’ll support VET learners as well as teachers in working with digital tools and methods. The project therefore provides project results like a podcast series with complementary material and a digital toolkit for VET teachers to help transfer existing materials into digital formats.
